

# Shop tills ring to Call of the Wild

A CD produced to help preserve critically endangered animal species is hitting the shelves of local shops.

*Call of the Wild* was created by Brenda and Paul Oakley-Carter, of [redacted] Close, Haverhill, with singer Paul setting to music a poem written by Brenda's father Ted Carter, who lives in Scotland.

Local companies rallied round to help them, with Terry McGerty at Printwise printing the covers, another anonymous benefactor supplying labels, Pure Energy copying the CDs and STP donating 1,000 blank CD disks.

Brenda said the help from local companies meant the CD was better quality and had a professional cover with the words inside – and more money went to the charities.

The CDs are £2.50 each with all profits going to the David Shepherd Wildlife Foundation and the Born Free Foundation.
