COMPARISONS to Dave Gilmour from Pink Floyd are not handed out lightly, but that's one of the many accolades being heaped upon a song written by a Haverhill man, and being sold for animal charities. Paul Oakley wrote Call Of The Wild from a poem

by his wife's father, and now Paul and his wife, Brenda Oakley-Carter are thanking the local businesses which

have enabled them to produce a CD.

The couple, of Cose, have appeared on BBC local radio stations among others to highlight the plight of rare animals, such as tigers, and the song has received rave reviews, even being favourably compared to rock greats Whitesnake.

Brenda said following their recent appearance on BBC radio, listeners flooded the station with positive comments – but now they are appealing for people to buy or download the song.

All profits from Call Of The Wild will go to Born Free, David Shepherd Wildlife Foundation, and the Whale and Dolphin Conservation Society.

The couple thanked Printwise, for printing the covers, Pure Energy for copying the CDs and STP for do-

ers, Fure Energy for copying the CDs and STF for donating 1,000 blank CDs.

Another firm, which wanted to remain anonymous,

donated 1,000 CD labels, which the couple have been applying manually.
